Introduction

Since 2011, more than 700 high school students have volunteered with Connexpedition overseas in Taiwan, teaching English and sharing their American culture while exploring the traditions, lifestyle, and values of the island nation. The program aims to provide meaningful service-learning experience combined with leadership development and cultural exchange opportunities. Members are invited to deepen their understanding of themselves and the world they live in while serving in a foreign community.

Program outcomes:

- Members will develop and grow as a young leader in the San Francisco Bay Area community.
 Members will display effective leadership within a team environment and learn to be responsible for their own actions.
- 2. Members will plan and lead a comprehensive 10-week online English program for the students of New Taipei City, acting as an academic role model for their students.
- 3. Members will successfully plan and execute a summer English program for the students of New Taipei City. This summer program will positively impact the students' motivation towards English education and show them that learning English can be fun.
- 4. Members will enjoy an international experience curated by program staff, host schools, and host students that will include many opportunities to participate in the local culture, cuisine, and lifestyle.



2024 Tentative Lesson Plans and Curriculum

We will be teaching lessons that are designed to help NTPC students build strong foundations in conversational English and vocabulary to help them deliver their presentation in week 2. The topics will be chosen by the students themselves at the beginning of the week, with guidance from the members, focusing on lifestyle-related topics.

New Taipei City Conference and Presentations

The ultimate goal of this program is to guide and mentor students while they create a 10-minute group presentation in English about a topic of their choosing. Their presentation and materials will be judged during the 1-day conference in the second week of the program.

Online Introductory Lessons – April to June 2024

Before embarking on the service trip to Taiwan in the summer, you will first meet your students online. You will be paired up with a partner to lead three online lessons for one class of about 8-10 students. Through these one-hour lessons, you will help your students build confidence in their English fluency and become familiar with their skill levels.

Online English Program – September to December 2024

After embarking on the service trip to Taiwan in the summer, you will continue to meet your students online in the fall. There will be one training session in September to prepare you for teaching online lessons. You will be paired up with a partner to lead 10 online lessons for one class of about 8-10 students to continue to build confidence in their English speaking and listening.

These online lessons will run from September through December. If you share the workload with your partner, you will teach online approximately once a month – only about four or five times over four months. You and your class will be assigned one set time and day of the week (Monday through Thursday). The lessons will be scheduled in the evening (Pacific time) to correspond to your students' lunchtime in Taiwan.

This schedule may still be adjusted according to various holidays and testing periods in the US and Taiwan.

Youth Programs Code of Conduct

Wisdom Culture and Education Organization (WCEO) reserves the right to amend the policies outlined below. Members of WCEO Youth Programs will be notified of any changes and are required to accept the changes or forfeit their position within their program.

- Members of Wisdom Culture and Education Organization (WCEO) Youth Programs must adhere
 to a ZERO-TOLERANCE policy towards the consumption of alcoholic beverages, use of smoke or
 tobacco products, possession of illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia and/or possession of illegal
 contraband.
- Wisdom Culture and Education Organization maintains a ZERO-TOLERANCE policy towards verbal, physical and sexual harassment of any kind (including peer-pressure and bullying).
 Participants who contribute to a hostile or uncomfortable environment at WCEO activities or otherwise will be dismissed immediately.
- "Hands-off policy": Youth Program members are encouraged to bond with others in their group, and often become very close. While intimate displays of affection beyond platonic physical interactions will not be tolerated, we encourage youth program participants to develop healthy personal relationships outside of WCEO activities.
- Dress code: Smart casual Volunteers are training to become teachers in a classroom. Clothes worn must be school appropriate and reflect a professional attitude.
- Wisdom Culture and Education Organization Youth Program activities require the undivided attention of participating members. Sustained use of personal electronics is highly discouraged.
 Repeat occurrences of distraction due to personal electronics use will not be tolerated.
- Youth Program participants must make every effort to attend planned program events and to show up prepared, ready to learn, and participate in program activities.
- Youth are responsible for keeping parents and guardians informed of Youth Program activities.
 Additional activities outside of WCEO Youth Program events may be planned and youth are responsible for informing parents or guardians that they are not program sponsored activities.
 Parents should work through their youth to stay informed and get questions answered, however, if concerns or questions are not being answered, parents should contact program directors.

Program Policies

Wisdom Culture and Education Organization (WCEO) reserves the right to amend the policies outlined below. Members of the Connexpedition program will be notified of any changes and are required to accept the changes or forfeit their position within the program.

Membership Policies

In addition to the adherence of Wisdom Culture and Education Organization's Youth Programs Code of Conduct, membership within the Connexpedition program will be subject to meeting the following policies and regulations:

- Dress code: Connexpedition staff will issue no more than 2 warnings if participants do not follow the dress code outlined in the Code of Conduct. The third infraction will result in dismissal from the program.
- Absence/Tardy Policy: Excused absences and instances of tardy must be reported by the Connexpedition member to Connexpedition staff a minimum of 18 hours prior to the scheduled meeting, event, activity, etc. Failure to inform a staff member about the absence or tardy will result in an unexcused absence.
 - Connexpedition 2024 members are only allowed a maximum of 2 absences (or a total of 10 hours)
 for all meetings and events during the training period.
 - An unexcused absence or tardy will result in the member being placed under a probationary period where any infractions of program policies regardless of instance will result in immediate dismissal.
- Throughout the program, members will have assignments to be completed at home. If members turn in an assignment after the set deadline or did not complete it at all, they will be given a warning. Members are also required to complete and submit any missed assignments due to absences. Members will be dismissed from the program after 2 warnings or if assignments are not made-up in a timely manner.
- Evaluations of all Connexpedition 2024 members will be made throughout the program by our program staff. If a member does not meet expectations or is found to be unqualified for the service trip, they will be dismissed from the program.
 - Some of the reasons members may be unqualified are, but not limited to, the following: lack of commitment to the program, poor service attitude, unprofessionalism, lack of skills necessary to teach in a classroom, inability to work within a team environment, inattentiveness.
- Participants are expected to follow curfew at the service locations set forth by Connexpedition staff. Failure
 to comply with curfew, leaving an event or campus without permission, or entering restricted areas will result
 in immediate dismissal.
- Uncooperative actions, such as failure to attend planned activities or events or disruptive behavior within a team environment, are subject to consequential action or dismissal at the discretion of Connexpedition staff.

In addition to dismissal due to infractions of above policies, Wisdom Culture and Education Organization reserves the right to terminate membership for any reason at any time. Please see the refund policies outlined in this document for policies regarding the refund of fees due to early termination of program membership.
